### REVIEW

**TRIBUTES OF LOVE AND AFFECTION: REMINISCENCES OF PROF. V.I. SUBRAMONIAM.** Gopalakrishnan, Naduvattom; Sankarankutty Nair, T.P.; Hariharan, C.S. (Eds.). 2019. Thiruvananthapuram – 695 586: Dravidian Linguistic Association of India. Pp. 212. Rs. 300/-.

The present book is a collection of memoirs in honour of Prof. Vadassery lyemperumal Subramoniam (Prof. VIS), doyen of Dravidian linguistics and founder of many academic and research institutions which facilitate and encourage scientific study of Indian languages in general and Dravidian languages in particular. He was respectfully referred to as Prof. VIS. VIS is preferred here for brevity. A few pieces of writings included in the volume are from members of his family and the remaining are from his students, colleagues and admirers.

The pieces of writing of his family members namely, Arun - his youngest son, Aashish Hariharan - his grandson, C.S. Hariharan - his son-in-law, Suba Arun - his daughter-in-law, Subramoniam Perumal his grandson and Santhi - his niece recollect the personality traits of VIS that they cherish.

In his memoir, Puthussery Ramachandran narrates the story of the founding of the Dravidian Linguistic Association of India and its off-shoots – International Journal of Dravidian Linguistics (IJDL), International School of Dravidian Linguistics (ISDL), under the leadership of VIS. A few of the projects undertaken and accomplished by senior scholars at ISDL are also listed.

G.K. Panikkar, a close associate of VIS for more than 46 years, gives an account of the contributions that VIS had made in the field of research guidance. He talks about the multifaceted personality of VIS, his ability in planning and executing various academic programmes and projects, his acumen in human resource management, his vision of developing academic

institutions, discipline, self-reliance and readiness to work hard and take risks to achieve the goal he sets. He was very quick in visualizing the role of computers in academic activities as early as 1960-s and deputed a member of his staff to attend a course in computer programming for language texts organized at Tata Institute of Fundamental Research, Mumbai in those days.

The story of the creation and the management of the Department of Linguistics by VIS, at the University of Kerala is narrated in the writing of B. Gopinathan Nair. He recalls how VIS planned and carried out the dialect survey project at the department, the role he played in the formation of DLA, opening of the publication wing of DLA to bring out its journal (IJDL) and other publications of the ISDL including DLA News. The initiative he had taken in the establishment of Tamil University and Dravidian University is also mentioned.
