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CONFERENCE ON INDIAN LANGUAGES

The Department of Linguistics, Central University of Kerala, in collaboration with Bharatiya Bhasha Samiti organized a one-day conference on Indian Languages on 19th March 2024 at the Sabarmati Hall of the university.

The inaugural session started at 10 a.m. with a warm welcome by Dr. G. Palanirajan, Assistant Professor, Department of Linguistics. The conference was inaugurated by Prof. K.C. Baiju, Vice Chancellor in charge. In his inaugural address, he underscored the imperative to revive Indian languages in educational settings and employment opportunities, providing the tone for the discussions ahead.
