Sociolinguistics, psychology, and neuroscience are the different disciplines in which the gender concept is widely discussed.

The four days seminar aims to look at the Gender concept in Linguistics beyond the perspectives of its grammatical features up to its expansion to semantic and sociological aspects which are significant in this era.
