# 51<sup>ST</sup> ALL INDIA CONFERENCE OF DRAVIDIAN LINGUISTS AND INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON RECENT TRENDS IN LINGUISTICS, LITERATURE, COMPARATIVE LITERATURE STUDIES AND TRANSLATION

Pollowed by the inaugural session on June 27<sup>th</sup> morning, endowment lectures and paper presentations began in the afternoon. Sessions were arranged in the Halls of the Tamil University, Thanjavur named after the four stalwarts of linguistics viz., (1) Prof. V.I. Subramoniam, (2) Prof. B.H. Krishnamurthy, (3) Prof. R.C. Hiremath, and (4) Prof. S.V. Shanmugam. From 27<sup>th</sup> afternoon to 29<sup>th</sup> 3.30 PM Memorial lectures and one special lecture were delivered as detailed below:

The folk dances of Tamil Nadu organised by the South Zone Cultural Centre, Thanjavur, Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India and performed at Karikalacholan Auditorium of Tamil University was a splendid function. In addition, the Official meetings such as the Governing Council of the ISDL, DLA Managing Committee Meeting, IJDL Managing Committee and Editorial Board Meeting were held on 27th evening and the General Body Meeting of the DLA was held on 28th evening. The Office-bearers of the ISDL, IJDL and DLA for the year 2024-25 were elected during these meetings.

According to him other languages approved by the Government of India should be developed to get the classical language status. He stressed the need to include Pali and Prakrit as classical languages under this scheme.

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#### NATIONAL TAMIL COMPUTING CONCLAVE (KANITAMIL): REPORT

The department of Computing Technologies, School of Computing. SRM IST & Tamil Perayam, SRM Institute of Science & Technology has jointly organized a National Conclave on Tamil Computing (Kanitamil) on 5th & 6th of August 2024. The inaugural ceremony started at 9.30 at Tech Park, SRM IST, Kattankulathur. The dignitaries spoke about the importance of Tamil Computing and how to take this forward. Sixty participants



including faculties from computing Technologies and various Engineering Colleges attended the conclave. This was followed by various sessions.

This session was led by Mr. Selvakumar M, Research Lead Engineer at Saama Technologies, who provided an insightful overview of building Large Language Models (LLMs) specifically for the Tamil language. The discussion began with an exploration of dataset curation, emphasizing the importance of quality and diversity in training data.

Session-2: The second session was led by Dr. Bharathi B, Associate Professor at SSN College of Engineering, Chennai. The focus was on the fundamentals and challenges of Tamil speech recognition. Dr. Bharathi began by outlining the goals of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in the context of speech recognition. emphasizing the need for models that can accurately interpret and process Tamil speech. She provided an in-depth explanation of Byte Pair Encoding (BPE), a method crucial for tokenizing and compressing text, which plays a significant role in improving the efficiency and accuracy of speech recognition systems.

Session-3: Dr. Subalalitha C.N., Associate Professor at the Department of Computer Technology, SRM IST, led this session on the use cases of Large Language Models (LLMs) for Tamil. Dr. Subalalitha began by discussing the Transformer model, originally invented by Google, which serves as the backbone for many modern LLMs.

**Session-4**: The panel discussion, moderated by Dr. B. Jai Ganesh of Tamil Perayam, featured insights from Mr. M. Balasubramani of Tamil Perayam, Dr. Subalalitha C.N. of the Department of Computer Technology, and Dr. R. Rajkumar of the Department of Data Science and Business Systems, SRM IST. The discussion revolved around the latest trends and emerging opportunities in Tamil computing, with a particular focus on the development and application of Large Language Models (LLMs).

Session-5: In this session, Dr. V. Dhanalakshmi, Professor at Subramani Bharathi School of Tamil Language and Literature, Pondicherry University, explored the crucial role of linguistically annotated data in developing language models. She began by discussing the challenges and strategies for engineering websites in Tamil, emphasizing the importance of linguistic precision.

**Valedictory:** The valedictory session marked the conclusion of an insightful and enriching series of discussions on Tamil computing and language models. The entire function came to an end with the vote of thanks to the SRM Management, Chairperson, Head of the Department, Conveners, Co-conveners, Coordinators, participants, students, faculty, and non-faculty members for their unwavering support and active participation, which made this event a grand success.
