HOW TO REACH THANJAVUR

The nearest airport to Thanjavur is Tiruchirappalli International Airport, 54 km away from the Tamil university, Thanjavur. There are regular flights from Chennai to Tiruchirappalli and Bangalore to Tiruchirappalli (both take 1 hour each) and also from Hyderabad to Tiruchirappalli which takes 1 and half hour.

The nearest railway station is Thanjavur Jn. (8 km. from Tamil university) which is well connected with Chennai. It is only six hours journey from Chennai to Thanjavur by train.

Bangalore is also connected with Thanjavur Jn. railway station by direct trains. Journey time is 10 hrs.

If you do not have direct train upto Thanjavur Jn. from your home location, then the alternative railway station is Tiruchirappalli Jn. (52km. from Tamil university) which is well connected with major railway stations in India. From Tiruchirappalli Jn. you can get frequent buses (AC & non-AC) to reach Tamil University, Thanjavur.

PARTICIPANT ENCODING IN THE MUNDA LANGUAGES

ONLINE LECTURE BY DR. GREGORY ANDERSON

The International School of Dravidian Linguistics conducted an online lecture on 17 January, 2024 as part of its ongoing lecture series. The speaker was Dr. Gregory D.S. Anderson, founder and president of Living Tongues Institute for Endangered Languages, Oregon, USA. The topic was "Participant Encoding in the Munda Languages : Flagging, Indexing and Language contact effects". Dr. Gregory Anderson presented a detailed analysis of participant encoding with reference to the major languages of the Munda family beginning with Pre-proto Munda (Proto-Afro-Asiatic) and its comparison with Pre-Aryan and Dravidian typology and poly personal verbs. The main languages of the Munda family such as Kherwarian, Santali, Birhor, Mundari, Juang, Sora, Juray etc., are covered in detail under the study.

"Dr. David McAlpin, passed away just before Christmas last year (*i.e., in 2023 December). As many of you know, he was the strongest proponent of the



Zagrosian (Elamo-Dravidian) hypothesis and had published a few recent articles on the topic. He was always interested in talking about anything related to history and linguistics. He will be missed."

Dr. David McAlpin was a member of the Dravidian Linguistic Association of India and was closely associated with the activities of the DLA and ISDL. His investigation into the relation of Elamite and Dravidian and his theory on the position of Brahui caught the attention of the researchers of both Dravidian and Elamite. Later he published the dissertation in three volumes which became a monumental work in Dravidian Linguistics. He has several other articles and research papers in many scholarly journals. His bibliography on the contribution of LVR deserves special mention. I am fortunate to have been a student of him while I was studying for the degree course at Mahatma Gandhi College, Thiruvananthapuram.

Technical Sessions at Research Hall, Department of Linguistics (Contd.)

The next session started at 12.20 P.M. with Dr. M. Rama (Former Professor of Kannada, Dept. of Linguistics, UoK) at the chair, and the presentation brought for discussion as follows: Mapping the Linguistic Structure of Doctor-Patient Communication in Kerala by Vilayil Surendra Babu Sooraj Babu& Dr. Drawin L. This paper attempted to analyze the apparent and non-apparent rules and power relations that dominated the consultation process in Kerala and explored how the consultation process is linguistically structured and socially characterized by specific rules. The Didactic Role of Subtitles by Ruba Alyaseen & Dr. S.A. Shanavas highlighted the importance of the didactic role of subtitles in translation studies and incorporating it into translation training. Ms. Anuja M.S. presented her paper on The Code-switching and Code-mixing of Tamil in Malayalam film Songs. The next paper Linguistic Competence in tribes and Social Change by Dr Aiswaria G. Shajan tried to explain how linguistic competence affects a tribe's life, results in transformation, and leads to endangerment. The next presentation was on Archaic Words in Kabilan Vairamuthu by Dr. K. Pasumpon, followed by The Effects of Collaborative Reflection and Class Observation on the Teacher Training course by Mansoureh Saeidpoor Sarcheshmeh & Dr. S.A. Shanavas. This study comprehension skills. Assessing Language Attitudes Towards Malappuram Malayalam: Combining Matched Guise Technique and Focus Group Discussions by Naseera Thesni K. & Dr. Reenu Ponnuse reported the results of a matched guise test (MGT) and focus group discussions (FGDs) conducted to assess the attitudes of Malappuram Malayalam (MM) speakers towards their variety. The next presentation was by Mr. Rahul Krishna H.S. & Dr. Syam S.K. on Data collection via social media - Pros and Cons. The session ended with the final paper presentation by Mithilaj J.S. & Dr. S.A. Shanavas on the Current Computational Tools Used in Speech Therapy.

Technical Session at V.I Subramoniam Conference Hall. CeLK Two technical sessions were conducted online at this venue from 10.30 A.M. to 1.30 P.M. Dr. P. Sreekumar (Associate Professor, Dept. of Linguistics, Central University of Kerala, Kasargod) chaired the first online technical session. The following papers were presented. The Phonetic Study of Strong and Weak Forms in Nepali English by Nisha Upadhayay explained how Nepali speakers of English use strong forms and weak forms in their speech, followed by Mr. Premchand Babarao Nagdeo's presentation on Error Analysis in Using the English Language at Higher Secondary Level: A Critical Review. This paper analyzed the errors in English language teaching at higher secondary level and examined the reason behind the problems. A study analyzing how social media use Language to appeal the curiosity and exploit the Emotional Reflex of Modern Society by Ashima Saseendra analyzed the Language of social media to understand how it is manipulated to exploit the curiosity and emotional reflex of the users of social media and the impact it can have on them. The following presentation was done by Anupama T. on the topic Is Humor a Socially Conditioned Reflex: A Survey

Analysis. The paper attempted to address questions like Would the people of the country be able to address the concerns of honour irrespective of the social status and power asymmetry of the speaker and the audience? Would humour perception be able to integrate itself into Indian culture? Dr. Loreina Pagag presented a paper on Strength Asymmetry and Positional Licensing: An Optimality Theoretic Perspective on Deletion in Missing. The study attempted to analyze the relevant positional markedness and positional faithfulness constraints in relation to velar nasal deletion and vowel deletion in Missing. A Comparative Study of the Culture and Oral Literature of the Snake Charmers in South and Eastern India by Sarmistha De Basu showed the relevance of the magic belief of the snake charmers of the Gangetic West Bengal and the Irulas, a tribal community of Tamil Nadu, Chengalpet region. The session concluded with a presentation on Word Order Idiosyncrasies in Himalayan Indo-Aryan Languages by Saket Bahu. This paper focused on word order idiosyncrasies such as aux-fronting, discontinuous two-part predicate, and finite verbs at the second constituent position, found in these languages but not in typical SOV languages.

Dr. S. Prema (Assistant Professor, Dept. of Linguistics, University of Kerala) chaired the second online session. The session covered presentations on the following papers: Case Markers in Yerukala by M.S. Bharath Kumar & Dr. M.C. Kesava Murty, followed by Analysing Politeness Strategies in Assamese Folktale Language by Gargi Dowarah & Sweta Sinha, which analyzed the different politeness strategies that are used in the language of the traditional stories of 'Burhi Aair Xadhu' (Grandmother's Tales) and their cultural implications by using the theoretical framework of Brown and Levinson. Using the Interface of Speech Act and Bloom's Taxonomy as an Aid in Teaching ESL by Seema & Abhigyan Dwived tried to explore the interface of Speech acts and Bloom's Taxonomy in English as a second language (ESL) teaching and learning. Cluster-dependent Epenthesis of English Loanwords in Varhadi, Mappila Malayalam, and Angika by Athira Raj P., Morey Dipak Tryambak, and Suyashi attempted to examine how vowel epenthesis or anaptyxis is employed as the most frequent cluster simplification process of English loanwords at onset and coda positions in three Indian dialects of scheduled languages-Varhadi (Marathi), Mappila Malayalam (Malayalam), and Angika (Maithili). Ms. N. Nirmeen & N. Vijayan presented a paper on Emotionality in Suicide Notes. The paper attempted to analyze the emotionality in a suicide note using a computerized method of text analysis software, Linguistic Inquiry Word Count, and manual analysis. The last presentation of this session was on Event, Individual, and Escher Sentences in Malayalam - An Experimental Study by Arun Prakash. This paper tried to examine how people interpret Escher sentences in Malayalam, modelling on Patrik Kelley's survey in the paper "Semantic Processing of Escher Sentences: Arriving at an Interpretation."
