52nd All India Conference of Dravidian Linguists and the International Symposium on Equipping Mother Tongue for Higher Education

Date: 19th -21st June 2025

The 52nd All India Conference of Dravidian Linguists in conjunction with the International Symposium on Equipping Mother Tongue for Higher Education was inaugurated on 19th June 2025 at the Centre of Advanced Study in Linguistics, Annamalai University. The conference aimed to bring together scholars, linguists, and policymakers to deliberate upon the importance of Dravidian languages and the integration of mother tongues in higher education.

He provided a brief historical overview of the Dravidian Linguistic Association of India and the role of ISDL in promoting advanced studies and research in Dravidian languages. Emphasizing the urgency to safeguard and revitalize Dravidian languages in the modern educational system, Prof. Panikkar called for a more robust framework to integrate mother tongues into higher education. He noted that language is not merely a medium of communication but also a carrier of cultural identity, thought processes, and indigenous knowledge. He stressed the need for collaborative academic ventures to promote mother-tongue-based education and multilingual pedagogy in higher education institutions. Prof. G.K. Panikkar also acknowledged the contributions of various scholars and institutions working in the field and praised the

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organizers at Annamalai University for their leadership in hosting this timely and impactful conference. His address served as a comprehensive prelude to the sessions that followed and set an intellectually vibrant tone for the rest of the event.

RENOWNED INDIAN LINGUIST PROF. E. ANNAMALAI HONOURED

In recognition of Professor E. Annamalai's contribution to Tamil Studies, his students and colleagues at the University of Chicago felicitated him on May 10, 2025 at L'Orientale University of Naples, Italy, where he gave a keynote on 'The Place of aakupeyar in Reading Texts: A Historical and Comparative Perspective' in a Workshop of reading Tamil and Sanskrit texts of Sivadharmam funded by the European Union. It was a celebratory event to



look back on the long academic career of Professor Annamalai in India and other countries that culminated at the University of Chicago. The event included presenting Professor Annamalai a festschrift titled 'For the Love of Tamil by Margherita Trento of School for Advanced Studies in Social Sciences (EHESS), Paris', one of the four editors of the volume (the book is published by the above University with Open Access and will be available to the public in a few months), offering reminiscences by Constantine Nakassis, Professor of Anthropology at the University of Chicago, another of the editors, presenting a shawl by Jean-Luc Chevillard, Professor Emeritus of National Center for Scientific Research (CNRS), France. Then Prof. E. Annamalai's students who now teach in U.S.A. spoke on the intellectual impact. Professor Annamalai responded with gratitude to the students who made his contributions possible by challenging him with their questions and different interpretations of the lines in texts. He traced the path of his transformation from a grammar specialist and a pedagogue of the Tamil language into a specialist of Tamil texts from the ancient to the modern ranging over literary, grammatical, religious and inscription genres.

S. MUKHTIAR SINGH GILL DEPARTED

S. Mukhtiar Singh Gill aka M.S.Gill was born in the heart of Malwa region of Punjab on 23 October 1937 at Sangrur District in Duggan village. He was appointed at Language Department of Punjab, Patiala as an editor in the year 1963. In 1968, he joined the Dept. of Anthropological Linguistics of Punjabi University, Patiala and worked in the Linguistic Survey Project initiated by Prof. Dr Harjeet Singh Gill. From the year 1970 to 1972 he was on deputation and was a part of Teaching of Punjabi as Foreign / Second Language for Central Institute of



Indian Languages Mysore. S. Mukhtiar Singh Gill got his M.Lit. degree from Anthropological Linguistics Dept. on Phonology of Malwai. From 1993 to 1996, he remained Head of the Department of Anthropological Linguistic, Punjabi University, Patiala. In the year 1992, the Department of Lexicography was also established under the Department of Linguistics and Punjabi language and M.S. Gill became its incharge being Head, Linguistics and Punjabi Language. From the year 1994 to 1997 he had an additional charge of the Dept. of Punjabi Lexicography. He co-edited the Punjabi University Punjabi-English Dictionary, Punjabi University English-Punjabi Dictionary with late Dr S.S. Joshi. He was also an editor of the 20th and 21st volumes of Department of Linguistics Journal 'Pàkha Sanjam'. S. Mukhtiar Singh Gill worked as an assistant editor of Punjabi Mahan Kosh Project of Punjabi University Patiala and brought out Encyclopaedia of Punjabi Language and Culture in two volumes along with the Phonetic Transcription of Adi Granth in four volumes. His departure is a great loss to Punjabi Linguistic Studies.

LSI SUBMITTED PROPOSAL TO UPSC TO INCLUDE LINGUISTICS AS SEPARATE SUBJECT

On 10th June, 2025, Prof. M J Warsi, President, LSI along with Prof Abhinav K Mishra, Secretary, LSI attended a scheduled meeting in Delhi with the Chairman and Secretary, UPSC and Additional Secretary, Ministry of Education, Government of India separately and submitted a detailed survey report about the academic institutions offering linguistics at undergraduate and postgraduate levels in our country and requested to give due importance to 'linguistics' at UPSC exams. The authorities have assured that they will take necessary steps in this regard at their earliest convenience.



The National Education Policy (NEP)-2020, has reformed the Indian education sector with a motive to make India a knowledge superpower by equipping its students with the necessary linguistic skills and knowledge and to eliminate the shortage of manpower in science, technology, academia and industry. In view of the pressing needs of the present times, it has become important for a multilingual country like India to have linguistics as part of the UPSC curriculum.

Prof. Warsi and Prof. A.K. Mishra apprised the concerned authorities about the importance of introducing linguistics as an independent subject in the UPSC curriculum. The LSI team explained to them that to qualify the UPSC exams, a strong foundation in linguistic principles is beneficial for success in the compulsory language papers and other optional papers. Many scholars have discussed the importance of language skills to qualify the UPSC exam from time to time. However, linguistics as a separate subject in the UPSC was a long standing demand from the students and aspirants who wanted to opt humanities and social science subjects to qualify the exams.



In the general studies papers, strong foundations in language and communication skills are necessary for effective writing, analytical thinking, and presenting arguments. Studying linguistics also helps in summarizing a text which requires an understanding of sentence structure, vocabulary, and the ability to identify the core meaning of a passage. It also helps in understanding the structure and meaning of language which is crucial for effectively comprehending passages. Getting trained in linguistics helps to have a strong grasp of grammar, which is essential for both English and the Indian language papers.

Inclusion of linguistics as a standalone subject would not only expand the horizon of students from Humanities and Social Sciences but also its concepts are also still very much relevant to several areas, particularly the compulsory language and optional papers. We appreciate the efforts of the LSI team (2024-26) and the entire linguistic fraternity for their unconditional support.

WORKSHOP ON ANDROID AND IOS APP DEVELOPMENT FOR PRESERVATION AND REVITALIZATION OF SOUTH DRAVIDIAN ENDANGERED TRIBAL LANGUAGES IN TAMIL NADU
